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## BILLS INTRODUCED BY SENATOR ENGLISH

- SB0002 RELATING TO THE PUBLIC LAND.  
Introduced by: Solomon M, English J  
Requires the department of land and natural resources to initiate and coordinate all efforts to establish a public land trust information system. Reports to the legislature. Appropriation. (\$\$) -- SB0002

- SB0006 RELATING TO AGRICULTURAL LANDS.  
Introduced by: Nishihara C, Wakai G, Chun Oakland S, English J  
Amends provisions relating to the amendments to district boundaries. Requires district boundary amendments involving agricultural lands with soil classified as overall productivity rating of class A or B to be processed by the land use commission. Provides that for a boundary amendment for agricultural lands soil classified by the land study bureau's detailed land classification as overall (master) productivity rating class A or B, no amendment of a land use district boundary shall be approved where a farming operation is being conducted on the land or has been conducted on the land previously, the land is important for agriculture based on the stock of similarly suited lands in the area, the district boundary amendment will harm the productivity or viability of existing agricultural activity in the area, and the district boundary amendment will cause fragmentation of or intrusion of nonagricultural uses into largely intact areas of agricultural lands with soil classification by the land study bureau's detailed land classification as overall (master) productivity rating class A or B. -- SB0006

Repeals and replaces the board of education. Provides that the board shall consist of 11 members who shall be appointed by the governor with the advice and consent of the senate, including 1 voting member who shall be a public high school student. Requires the board to invite the senior military commander in Hawaii to appoint a nonvoting military representative. Repeals the election of the board of education. -- SB0008 SD1

- SB0099 RELATING TO THE PUBLIC UTILITIES COMMISSION.  
Introduced by: Baker R, Solomon M, English J, Kahele G, Tsutsui S, Kouchi R, Green J, Chun Oakland S  
Establishes provisions relating to notice of hearing required under the Hawaii water carrier act. Requires the public utilities commission to provide reasonable notice whenever the commission conducts a public hearing on an application for a certificate of public convenience and necessity. -- Amends provisions relating to public utilities commission; number, appointment of commissioners, qualifications; compensation; persons having interest in public utilities by adding establishment and composition of panel. Requires the commission to elect its chairperson from 1 of its members instead of being appointed by the governor. Requires the commission to establish 2 panels with membership consisting of 2 commissioners plus the chairperson. Further requires that 1 panel to be devoted to issues relating to energy and the private water and sewage utilities and the other panel to be devoted to issues relating to motor and water carrier transportation services, telecommunications, and warehousing of goods. Amends provisions relating to employment to executive officer; appointment of assistants. Requires the commission to employ staff to include an executive officer, administrative personnel, and other personnel necessary to carry out the duties of the commission. Requires the commission to post a link on the front page of the commission's website to publicly accessible electronic version of each application for a certificate, each order of the commission regarding posted applications, and the commission's final decision and order. Requires the commission to issue a certificate to any qualified applicant authorizing the whole or any part of the operations proposed in the application. Prohibits the commission to make finding of public convenience and necessity or issue an authorization, whether interim, permanent, or otherwise, to operate as a water carrier without specific finding supported by evidence in record indicates that the issuance of the certificate will diminish an existing water carrier's ability to realize its allowed rate of return or if the certificate would allow an applicant to serve only high margin or high profit ports or lines of service that are currently served by and existing carrier. -- SB0099

Requires the Hawaii tourism authority to contract with a private nonprofit engaged in promoting Hawaiian culture, for the development and maintenance of a comprehensive Hawaiian cultural resource inventory database. Requires matching funds from the office of Hawaiian affairs. Annual report to the legislature and the governor. Appropriation. (\$\$) -- SB0108

- SB0109 RELATING TO HOUSING.  
Introduced by: Galuteria B, Chun Oakland S, Kidani M, English J  
Amends provisions relating to resident selection; dwelling units; rentals by adding grandchildren in family crisis. Prohibits an elder to be eligible for a larger dwelling unit because a minor grandchild or grandchildren are living with the elder due to a family crisis. Requires the Hawaii housing authority, upon verification of a family crisis to allow a minor grandchild of a tenant of an elderly housing project to temporarily live with the tenant for no longer than 3 months, if due to the family crisis, the minor would otherwise be without appropriate care. Allows the authority to use its discretion to determine if other situations constitute a family crisis. -- SB0109

Allows the Hawaii health system corporation to lease Kula hospital's medical clinic to the Community Clinic of Maui, Inc., doing business as Malama I Ke Ola Health Center for 1 dollar per year for 10 years, with the option to renew. -- SB0121

Establishes the 2050 sustainability policy under the Hawaii state planning act. -- SB0283

Requires the department of public safety to establish temporary pilot program to be known as the Hawaiian cultural restoration program to provide working opportunities for non violent inmates of Hawaiian ancestry to participate in the restoration and rebuilding of sites culturally significant to Hawaiian history and to provide skills development training that will incorporate instruction in the methods of rebuilding the historical site as well as the background and cultural significance of the site. Requires the office of Hawaiian affairs to determine and identify the sites to be restored. Program to cease to exist on June 30, 2015 (sunset). Appropriation. (\$\$) -- SB0284

Establishes provisions relating to telehealth services; medicaid and QUEST. Prohibits the department of human services to require the department's approval for a health plan under the department's Medicaid or QUEST programs to deliver services using a telehealth service; in person visits to qualify any telehealth service for coverage under the department's Medicaid or QUEST programs; or the mobile medical van program operating in a county with a population of less than 250,000 persons and operated by Kona community hospital to be funded through a partnership with a non profit mutual benefit society that provides health care coverage to at least 600,000 members. Act to be repealed on June 30, 2013 (sunset). -- SB0285

Amends provisions relating to inspection. Provides that in underserved, remote areas the board of agriculture is required to designate private agents who are authorized to inspect or classify agricultural commodities. -- SB0286

Introduced by: Tsutsui S, Baker R, English J  
Amends provisions relating to uhu; goatfish; bag limit. Prohibits any person to take, possess, or sell more than 2 of each of the following species of goatfish; kumu, moano ukali, munu, and uhu per day

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on Maui. Allows a commercial marine dealer to possess and sell more than 2 kumu, moano ukali, munu, and uhu with receipts issued for the purchase. Requires the kumu, moano ukali, and munu to be at least 10 inches in length and uhu to be at least 12 inches in length if taken on Maui. -- SB0578

### RELATING TO ELECTIONS.

Introduced by: Tsutsui S, Baker R, English J

Amends provisions relating to boards of registration, appointment, tenure. Requires each board of registration to be in the department of accounting and general services. Increases the number of members from 3 to 5 with a term of 4 years. Prohibits any board from consisting entirely of member of 1 political provided that no more than 2 members of any board shall be affiliated with the same political party; at least 2 member of each board shall be non partisan; and all members of each board shall be in good standing within their respective political parties. -- SB0579

### RELATING TO AQUATIC LIFE.

Introduced by: Tsutsui S, Baker R, English J

Amends provisions relating to selling of aquatic life for aquarium purposes; prohibited; penalties; fines. Provides that it is unlawful for any person at any time to knowingly or intentionally sell or offer to sell, for aquarium purposes, aquatic life taken from any of the waters within the jurisdiction of the State. Makes it a misdemeanor. Establishes penalties and fines. -- Amends provisions relating to permits to take aquatic life for aquarium purposes. Prohibits the taking of aquatic life for aquarium purposes or use fine meshed traps or fine meshed nets other than throw nets to take marine or freshwater nongame fish and other aquatic life for aquarium purposes without an aquarium fish permit. -- Repeals provisions relating to aquarium fish for export; monthly count. -- SB0580

### RELATING TO MENTAL HEALTH.

Introduced by: Tsutsui S, Baker R, English J

Establishes provisions relating to Hawaii mental health commission; establishment and organization. Establishes the Hawaii health authority within the department of health to be an autonomous public body corporate and politic and an instrumentality of the State; to be responsible for overall mental health planning for the State and determine future capacity needs of mental health providers, facilities, equipment, and support services providers. Requires the authority to develop a comprehensive mental health plan and utilize findings obtained by the state council on mental health to further the development of the mental health plan. Amends provisions relating to definitions under department of health. Repeals the term department. Beginning July 1, 2013 transfers all rights, powers functions, and duties of the department of health with respect to mental health, mental illness, drug addiction, and alcoholism to the Hawaii mental health commission. -- SB0581

### RELATING TO COUNTY MUTUAL AID.

Introduced by: Tsutsui S, Baker R, English J

Establishes the county mutual aid sharing of fresh water law. Establishes a mutual aid network of assistance among the counties where a county shall provide portable water and non portable water to another county during times of emergency if the mayor of an affected county petitions the governor to declare that an emergency exists within the affected county. -- Establishes the Hawaii statewide mutual aid system law. Designates the mayor of each county as the emergency management director for that county who shall serve as the governor's agent and who shall appoint an emergency management coordinator. Requires a county to render mutual aid to another county under a county mutual aid agreement executed among each of the counties. Establishes provisions relating to special mutual aid program for fire emergencies; creation of the Hawaii statewide mutual aid system administered by the department of defense; reimbursement of costs; State request or federal disaster relief; and reimbursement of costs by requesting county in the absence of a federal disaster declaration. -- SB0582

### RELATING TO CABLE TELEVISION SYSTEMS.

Introduced by: Tsutsui S, Baker R, English J

Establishes provisions relating to designation of access organizations for PEG (public education and government) access channels. Authorizes the director of commerce and consumer affairs to designate an access organization to oversee the development, operation, supervision, management, production or broadcasting of programs on PEG channels. Requires the director to establish requirements for the designation of access organization and ensure that the terms, conditions required of the operation of an access organization designated are fair to the public, taking into account the geographic, topographic, and economic characteristics of the service area and the economics of providing cable access in the service area. Provides that any decision designation, modifying, or rescinding a

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designation of an access organization or the requirements shall 1st be submitted for review to the cable advisory committee for advice. Amends provisions relating to cable advisory committee. Requires the committee to advise the director and access organizations on matters within the jurisdiction at the request of the director or any access organization and on any decision designating, modifying, or rescinding a designation of an access organization or the requirements. -- SB0583

### RELATING TO EDUCATION.

Introduced by: Kim D, Kidani M, Shimabukuro M, Chun Oakland S, Tokuda J, English J, Espero W  
Establishes an electronic book pilot program in the department of education for students in 1 intermediate or middle school. Requires the department to supply books in a digital format to be read directly from the screen of a personal computer, laptop, or other portable device. Report to the legislature. Appropriation. (\$\$) -- SB0601

### RELATING TO THE KAHOOLOWE ISLAND RESERVE COMMISSION.

Amends provisions relating to the Kahoolawe island reserve commission. Reduces the number of members on the commission from 7 to 5. Requires the governor to appoint 2 members in consultation with native Hawaiian organizations. Prohibits any member from being reappointed to the commission within 4 years from the last day of the member's service immediately preceding the reappointment to the commission. -- SB0609

### RELATING TO THE EMPLOYEES' RETIREMENT SYSTEM.

Introduced by: Baker R, Green J, English J

Amends provisions relating to bonus; pensioners' special compensation; amounts available. Requires each state and county retiree who is 75 years of age and older with at least 20 years of retirement as of June 30, 2011, to receive an annual lump sum pension payment equal to 1 dollar per month of every year of the retirant's credited service. Appropriation. (\$\$) -- SB0649

Establishes the foreclosure mediation special fund to be expended by the executive director of the office of consumer protection to defray the costs of foreclosure mediation. Establishes provisions relating to mortgage foreclosure mediation. Requires the foreclosing mortgagees to engage in mediation with the mortgagors prior to initiating non judicial foreclosure. Annual report to the legislature and governor. -- SB0651

Amends provisions relating to findings and purpose under real estate brokers and salespersons. Requires the department of commerce and consumer affairs to analyze the impact of expanding the current scope of the real estate brokers and salesperson chapter to include the regulation of real estate appraisal management companies, in order to accommodate the applicable provisions of the Financial Institutions Reform, Recovery, and Enforcement Act of 1989 (FIRREA), 12 US code section 3331 et seq., and the federal rules adopted. Report to the legislature. -- SB0653

### RELATING TO THE LABELING OF GENETICALLY ENGINEERED CROPS.

Amends provisions relating to food, drugs, and cosmetics law. Prohibits the sale, offering for sale, or distribution of any farm product grown in Hawaii that is a genetically engineered whole food, intended for human consumption in the State, and does not have affixed to the product a conspicuous genetically engineered label. -- SB0713

Amends provisions relating to electronic filing of tax returns. Requires the department of taxation to establish a system to allow taxpayers to file tax returns, applications, reports, and other documents,

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electronically, telephonically, or by optical means at no additional cost to the taxpayer. -- Amends provisions relating to general excise tax. Changes the due date for general excise tax returns and payments from the 20th to the last day of the month. -- SB0756

Amends provisions relating to a penalty under the Kahoolawe island reserve law. Requires forfeiture of any equipment, article, instrument, aircraft, vehicle, vessel, business record, or natural resource used or taken in violation of the laws or rules applicable to the island reserve. -- SB0815

RELATING TO KAHOOLAWE ISLAND RESERVE.

Amends the Kahoolawe island reserve law. Redefines island reserve to include the island of Molokini and the submerged lands and waters extending seaward 2 miles from its shoreline. Requires the Kahoolawe island reserve commission to adopt rules to permit fishing in the waters around Molokini. -- SB0817

RELATING TO EMINENT DOMAIN.

Amends provisions relating to general powers and limitation of the counties. Provides that the counties may exercise their power of condemnation by eminent domain provided that no county shall condemn private property and subsequently transfer that same property to a private entity that expressed an interest in purchasing the same property for development or commercial purposes or private use before the condemnation. -- Amends provisions relating to taking private property for public use; disposal of excess property. Allows private property to be taken for public use provided that the public use for the purposes of eminent domain powers shall not be construed to include the condemning of private property and the subsequent transfer of that same property to a private entity that expressed an interest in the purchasing that same property for development or commercial purposes or private use before the condemnation. -- SB0818

Requires the department of transportation to establish a vehicle miles traveled pilot program to evaluate a vehicle miles traveled user fee. Further requires the department to develop 1 or more pilot programs to test alternatives to state and county motor vehicle fuel taxes. -- SB0819

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designated shall be allocated operating funds by categorical allotments that guarantee the funding minimum number of instructional positions to ensure at least minimum course requirements are maintained. Defines remote school to mean any high school that is located at least a 1 hour drive away from the next nearest public high school or located on the island of Lanai, Molokai, or Niihau. -- SB0821

Provides that a transportation services contract or agreement, a motor carrier and an indemnitee shall not agree to require a motor carrier to indemnify, defend, or hold the indemnitee harmless; or agree to a provision that has the effect of indemnifying, defending, or holding the indemnitee harmless from any claims or liability for the negligence or intentional acts or omissions of the indemnitee. -- SB0824

Allows the director of health to deny, suspend, or revoke a producer's processor's license after a hearing in any case in which it is determined that there has been a violation or refusal to comply with requirements or rules adopted. Prohibits a licensed producer to sell or deliver marijuana to any person other than a department inspector, licensed process, licensed dispenser, or law enforcement officer exempts court orders. Prohibits a licensed dispenser to sell marijuana received from any person other than a licensed producer or licensed process, or sell or deliver marijuana to any person other than a qualifying patient or primary caregiver except as provided by court order. Prohibits a licensed producer, licensed processor, or licensed dispenser to advertise marijuana for sale to the general public in any manner that promotes or tends to promote the use or abuse of marijuana. Requires the department of public safety to create and maintain a secure and confidential list of licensed producers, licensed processors, and licensed dispensers; develop a secure and confidential system providing adequate identification that a person is a licensed producer, licensed processor, or licensed dispenser; maintain a log of all request for no less than 3 years; establish and collect reasonable fees for the dissemination of information to employees of state and local law enforcement agencies. Requires the auditor to conduct a cost benefit evaluation of the implementation of this act.
