Establishes a task force on mobility management within the department of health to make recommendations establishing a transportation framework that assist elders with transportation needs in rural communities, including recommendations relating to the state budget and program development. Requires the working group to consider including in the mobility management master plan framework a transportation service component that utilizes the transportation resources of nonprofit organization that are willing to participate in a vehicle sharing network that provides on call transportation services to elders residing in rural communities. Requires the department of health, through the executive office on aging to submit an interim report of the task force's findings and recommendations, including any proposed legislation. Report to the legislature. Task force to dissolved on June 30, 2015 (sunset). Appropriations. (\$\$) -- HB0131 HD2

Establishes provisions relating to dangerous wheels; prohibited. Prohibits a person to operate a vehicle, trailer, or semi trailer equipped with dangerous wheels. -- HB0146 HD2

Amends provisions relating to the rental motor vehicle and tour vehicle surcharge tax. Defines car sharing organization to mean an organization that operates a membership program in which its members are permitted to use vehicles from the organization's fleet on an hourly basis at hourly rates that include the cost of insurance and the cost of the vehicle to the organization. Provides that in the case of rentals made by a car sharing organization to its members the surcharge tax shall be prorated at 12.5 cents per hour. -- HB0551 HD2

Amends Act 317, session laws of 2012, relating to safe routes to school program special fund by repealing the appropriation. Provides that the fees deposited for each fiscal year into the safe routes to school special fund, when appropriated, shall be available to the department of transportation to administer the safe routes to school program including the cost of equipment and general administrative overhead and that funds may also be delegated by the director of transportation to the respective counties. -- HB0591 HD1

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licensed salvage processor or body shop, or otherwise at the direction of an insurer, to release a motor vehicle that was towed unless the party recovering the vehicle provides proof that the vehicle is currently registered. -- HB0602 HD2

Requires the department of transportation to develop a training program for emergency responders who are called to an emergency situation involving electric vehicles and to study the potential dangers involved and any precautionary measures needed for emergency personnel. Amends provisions relating to metropolitan planning organization membership by increasing policy committee members. Requires 1 member to be the executive director of the Honolulu authority for rapid transportation or successor. -- HB0689 HD1

Authorizes the issuance of harbor revenue bonds for harbor capital improvement projects to the department of transportation for Kapalama military reservation, Kalaeloa Barbers Point harbor, Hilo harbor, Kahului harbor, Hana harbor, Kawaihae harbor, and Nawiliwili harbor. Authorizes the governor to use the harbor special fund to finance these projects. (\$\$) -- HB0692 HD2

RELATING TO COMPLETE STREETS.

Amends provisions relating to public hearing for decision making; separate hearing required. Requires the Hawaii community development authority to notify the mayor of the county whenever a developer's proposal to develop lands under the authority's control includes improvements to a county highway or any land owned by the county adjacent to a county highway in accordance with the complete streets rules adopted by the authority and to provide the affected county with an opportunity to present its position on the proposed improvements at the public hearing at which the proposal is presented; provided that the public hearing shall not occur earlier than 20 days after the notice is given. Requires the authority's decision to include findings that the proposed improvements are consistent with the affected county's adopted complete streets policy and principles, consistent with the national complete streets best practice guidelines, and reflective of current best practices in the affected county. Requires the decision by the authority be final and binding on the county. Requires the county to permit the approved improvements to be constructed and once the improvements are constructed in accordance with the complete streets rules adopted by the authority, requires the county to accept dedication thereof. -- Amends provisions relating to community development rules. Amends provisions relating to use of highway fund for bikeways. Changes out of state fund to State fund. Provides that when the department of transportation determines that establishment of bikeways is not practicable, requires the department to also consult with the bicycling community to identify an alternative bikeway project or projects using funds that would otherwise have been expended. Amends the annual report to the legislature to be submitted no later than 20 days before the convening of each regular session and to identify any instances in which it was determined that establishing the bikeways was not practicable. -- HB1080 HD1

Amends provisions relating to recovery of overcharges or undercharges. Prohibits a common carrier by motor vehicle in violation of certification or permit requirements to enforce undercharge recoveries. Amends provisions relating to collection of rates and charges. Allows a person who uses the services of a common carrier by motor vehicle operating in violation to bring an action in court of competent jurisdiction to recover all compensation paid by the person to that carrier for those services; provided that on a complaint filed by the person with the public utilities commission has by order determined the common carrier to be in violation of certificate or permit requirements. -- HB1101 HD2

Requires the director of transportation to assist in the mitigation of traffic congestion from west Oahu to designate a separate extended lane from the on ramp at Fort Weaver road to the H-1 (H1) Queen Liliuokalani freeway for traffic originating from Kunia and traveling east bound; ensure that the right shoulder lane on the H-1 Queen Liliuokalani freeway is opened during morning traffic hours, determined by the director to be heavy traffic hours, from Kapolei to exit number 5, Kunia road; and designate an additional lane that extends from Waipahu street to Fort Weaver road and onto the on ramp at Fort Weaver road to the H-1 Queen Liliuokalani freeway and obtain all federal authorizations required to take the traffic mitigation actions. -- HB1112 HD1

Amends provisions relating to motorcycles and mopeds, noisy mufflers; penalty. Prohibits a person to modify the exhaust system of a moped manufactured after December 31, 2013, in a manner that will amplify or increase the noise emitted by the moped above that emitted by the original mufflers indicated on the label attached to the moped in accordance with federal regulations. -- HB1189 HD1

Amends provisions relating to bicycle and moped fee. Requires mopeds to be registered on a staggered basis based upon the month of initial registration and to be subject to an annual registration fee of 15 dollars, and submit a current certificate of inspection (safety check). -- Amends provisions relating to inspection of vehicles by adding mopeds. Requires mopeds to be certified every year. Provides that mopeds manufactured after December 31, 2013, shall be issued a certificate of inspection only if the exhaust system of the moped meets the specifications of the original manufacturer, and all other applicable requirements for the issuance of a certificate of inspection are satisfied. -- Requires a person to pass a moped education course approved by the department of transportation to drive a moped. Increases the fine for modifying a moped motor. -- HB1324 HD2

Requires certification by the department of business, economic development, and tourism. Repeals the ethanol facility income tax credit. -- SB0018

Amends provisions relating to prerequisites for obtaining coverage. Requires liability coverage to be in the form of a temporary insurance binder issued for a period of not more than 180 days from the date of learner's permit issuance to a person who has a valid motorcycle or motor scooter learner's permit. Provides that if the person does not obtain a license within the period of temporary insurance coverage, the persons will be required to enroll in an approved motorcycle education course in order to continue insurance coverage beyond the 180 day limit. Allows a 2nd temporary insurance binder covering a period of not more than 90 days to be issued to a person who has a valid motorcycle or motor scooter learner's permit. -- SB0271

Amends provisions relating to the county surcharge on state tax. Prohibits any further surcharge be collected after June 30, 2013 (sunset). Requires that all moneys that remain unexpended by the county on June 30, 2013, be returned to the state. -- SB0275

Amends provisions relating to motor vehicle inspection (safety check). Requires the director of transportation to prescribe uniform standards and procedures for motor vehicle equipment. -- Provides that any vehicle that has been involved in an accident may be deemed to be in unsafe condition if it is determined by a police officer or an insurer that the vehicle's equipment has been damaged so as to render the vehicle unsafe. -- Repeals provisions requiring any vehicle to be inspected certified every 12 months. -- SB0290

Amends provisions relating to expiration of licenses. Requires that any drivers license issued to a person who is 71 years of age or older, at the time, is to expire on the licensee's 79th birthday, or 2 years from the date of license issuance, whichever is later in time. -- SB0294

Amends provisions relating to state registration fee. Reduces the fee to 38 dollars beginning July 1, 2013, and to 31 dollars beginning July 1, 2014, and reduces the amount deposited into the state highway fund to 33 dollars beginning July 1, 2013, and to 26 dollars beginning July 1, 2014. -- SB0334

Prohibits a person to operate a motor vehicle upon any public highway unless the person is restrained by a seat belt assembly and all passengers in the front or back seat of the motor vehicle are restrained by a seat belt assembly or are restrained pursuant to the child restraint law if under 8 years of age. -- SB0340

Amends provisions relating to State vehicle weight tax; exemptions. Requires any totally and permanently disabled veteran who is a resident of Hawaii and is honorably discharged from the uniformed armed forces to be charged a tax on 1 registered vehicle. Provides that for a vehicle up to and including 10,000 pounds net weight the tax shall be 50 dollars and for a vehicle over 10,000 pounds net weight the tax shall be 100 dollars. -- SB0349

Amends provisions relating to court advisement concerning alien status required. Requires the court to advise on the record to the defendant that if the defendant is not a citizen of the US, that a guilty plea, nolo contendere plea, a deferred acceptance of guilty plea, a deferred acceptance of nolo contendere plea or a conviction of the offense for which you have been charged may have the consequences of deportation, exclusion from admission to the US, or denial of naturalization pursuant to the laws of the US. -- SB0443

RELATING TO HIGHWAY TRAFFIC SAFETY.

Establishes provisions relating to motor vehicles; drive on right side of roadway; exceptions. Requires the operator of a commercial motor vehicle to use the traffic lane that is as near to the right side of the roadway as practicable when driving on any roadway having 4 or more clearly marked lanes for traffic in 1 direction. Requires the operator of a commercial motor vehicle to use the lane to the immediate left of the right hand lane when overtaking and passing another vehicle proceeding in the same direction. -- SB0459

SB0477

RELATING TO MOTOR CARRIERS.

Introduced by: English J (BR)

Amends provisions relating to collection of rates and charges. Prohibits any person who does not hold a certificate or permit issued by the public utilities commission for any freight transportation collection of rates and charges to demand payment of more than tariff rates and charges. Provides that any person who does not hold a certificate or permit issued by the commission shall not detain any freight of a customer until the customer pays the common carrier for prior non paid service. SB1343

RELATING TO ADEQUATE HIGHWAY REQUIREMENTS.

Introduced by: Shimabukuro M

Establishes provisions relating to adequate highway capacity requirement. Requires the transportation system of each county to provide adequate highway capacity for major peak hour commuting to work in county business districts. Prohibits new subdivision or housing development project to commence above ground construction until the director of transportation certifies to the governor that adequate highway capacity exists. -- SB1343
